#### **SECURITY**

## **GUIDELINES TO LIVE BY**

Priorité	
1. Respect	All members of our school community are requested to show respect towards themselves, others and all materials that are made available to them.
2. En français svp	We will ensure that your child will learn the French language and culture. However, it is important that all students speak French at all times during school hours. We require the presence of all students at our cultural activities such as BBSV, RaJe, plays, musical performances and carnivals to fully appreciate the culture.
3. Healthy students, happy students	We promote healthy eating habits. We ask that you send good nutritional snacks and lunches.  We have several students with <b>nut allergies</b> at school. Therefore we ask you to refrain from sending foods containing nuts.
4. Punctuality and absences	The school is open to students at <b>8h25</b> in the mornings. Although classes begin at 8h39 and end at 15h21.  Should your child be absent, please use the <u>School Messenger</u> communication system or contact the school to let us know. Also, you are asked to contact your
	school bus driver if he does not need to pick up your child.
5. Homework and nightly reading	To provide a continued academic progression , we ask that your child read every night.
	Please use the communication tool used by the classroom teacher regularly. Some teachers use the agenda other use learning platform of Seesaw or Google Classroom to communicate homework and assignments.
6. Dress code	All students are required to wear clean running shoes that are non-marking for all gym classes.
	Students are to dress modestly as the school is their place of work. All vulgar or explicit logos on clothing is prohibited.
	Students may wear hats / caps on Friday.
7.Technology	Students in grande 7-12 can purchase or rent a laptop computer. They must read and respect code of conduct while using our school network and property.
8. Lunch hour departures	Students in grade 7-12 may leave during lunch hour if they have a parental consent to do so. Please provide consent forms if you choose this option for your child.
9. Bibliothèque / Library	All students will go to the library at least once a week. They have the option to choose french and english books. It is important that they return them in due time.
10.Transportation	Our school board Conseil scolaire Centre-Est provides bus transportation through KRUES Busing. All parents are strongly encouraged to download and register with the TRAVERSA RIDE 360 application to get current communication notices and to see live view of bus location.

11. Communication	The school prinicipal will ensure prompt and punctual communication with all parents regularly. Most weekly information will be shared via email. Please check our school website for comprehensive information.  Keep these websites bookmarked for easy access:  Site web de Sommet,  Calendrier d'évènements
12. Bande Dessinée / Concession	We offer a daily concession that is available to all students as well as a stocked vending machine. Please see the attached sheet for individual items and prices.  This service is organized by Mme Céleste Bilodeau and the grade 10 students as a
	fundraiser towards their graduation.
13. Music	We will ensure that students from maternelle to gr.9 will have the opportunity to learn and enhance their musical talents.
	Throughout the year, your child will have the opportunity to participate in musical performances, concerts and festivals in order to share their talent with the school community.
14. Sports	Students at École du Sommet will have a physical education class 4 out of 5 days a week.
	It is strongly recommended that out grade 5-12 students bring a change of clothes for gym class to reinforce personal hygiene.
	Our students will also have the opportunity to join our extracurricular teams and individual sports and competitions offered through S.P.A.A and A.S.A.A
15. Repas chauds / Hot lunch	A free hot lunch program will be available as of October. We intend to plan one free meal a week for our students. Families will receive a order form shortly.
16. Orientation et hors campus	M. Troy Gratton, is our Career counsellor. He offers a service to our secondary students in order to ensure that all diploma requirements are met for the pursuit of post-secondary studies. M. Gratton is also responsible for all off campus program such as work Experience, RAP (Registered Apprenticeship Program) and outdoor education courses.
17. Religion	Our school is a catholic school that offers religion courses from kindergarten to grade 10. Our school community supports christian values that will be celebrated throughout the year thru means of liturgies and celebrations.
18. Club d'aide à la lecture et à l'étude / Reading and Study Club	This club is directed by Mme Sophie Tillley and Mme Cynthia Touko. The focus is to assist students from gr. 3 thru gr.6 with their reading and the acquisition of good study skills. This club will start in October and will run twice a month.
19.Atelier de création / Maker- space	Elementary students have access to a makerspace that encourages innovation, creativity, critical thinking and problem resolution. This space needs regular refurbishing and we will be informing families of various materials needed throughout the year.
20. Options	Our junior and high school students have access to a variety of option classes such as shop, culinary arts, sewing, programming, drama. Each year options are determined by student interest and staff capacity.
